Food for Preston

"Kevin," a Preston County high school senior, was already receiving food from Food for Preston's weekly backpack program bag when he was suddenly living on his own and unsure of how to make ends meet. Stay in school or get a job? Preston County Schools, Food for Preston, and local churches pooled resources to give him everything he needed, from notebooks, clothing, and boots, to shampoo, pots/pans, and weekly boxes of food to ensure he could stay in school and complete his senior year.

American Red Cross

In July 2022, multiple units of the Bon Vista Apartments complex caught fire in Morgantown. Notified by the Star City Fire Department, local American Red Cross team members arrived on scene and immediately began working to ensure the people impacted would have shelter, food, emotional support, and additional necessities to begin their recovery process. Thankfully no one was seriously injured, but in total, 8 apartments were destroyed and 13 people assisted.

CASA for Kids  
"Lewis" was a CASA kid who had been in the foster care system since 2017. His CASA advocate has been with him from the very beginning. He recently wrote a letter to Governor Justice inviting him to his adoption. It read, "I wanted to tell you that I found a family and they are nice. They are going to ADOPT ME!!!!!! I am so excited! They teach me so much. My favorite person is my CASA. My Mom is a good cook, and my dad has his own business. I love them!!! I hope to see you soon."

Visiting Homemakers  
"Daniel" has been a client of Visiting Homemakers for 6 years. Living with Lewy Body Dementia, the 82 year old is getting progressively worse each day and doesn't have any relatives nearby to help. But three times a week, the same homemaker who has been visiting Daniel for 6 years, comes to his home to help him bathe, dress, make meals, do laundry, go grocery shopping, and take him to doctor's visits. Without the agency, he would have been placed in a senior living facility or a nursing home.
